The prospective plan for the college by the IQAC, Govt. College Theog, designed in the month of June, 2017 was approved for implementation by the Principal. The Mentor Program already existent in concept was to be activated in full swing to ensure enhanced engagement of the teachers with the students. All teachers would be mentors and student mentees would be allotted to the mentors. Mentor-Mentee interaction would be scheduled every month. Value based topics could feature actively in these sessions. Mentors were to take overall responsibility for their mentees' well being- academic as well as personal.

The Women Cell would expand its scope and activities by engaging male-students and ensuring gender-sensitivity amongst all students of the college. The cell was to be directed to accelerate its awareness programs pertaining to gender equity.

A detailed schedule was designed to ensure implementation of the mentor program. The mentor groups were constituted and notified on the college notice board and also displayed on the college website for information of the students. Mentor sessions were slotted between 12:00-1:00 p.m. every 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday. Students' Identity Cards carrying a page each for information and record of the mentor program were signed by the mentors during each session. Basic data about the mentees was maintained by the mentors. These sessions were used for imparting values and counseling to the mentees. At the end of the session, the mentors were asked to prepare brief yet comprehensive reports about their sessions with mentees.

The Women Cell was directed to submit a prospective plan of its proposed annual activities for the session, 2017-18. The Cell suggested that more programs to encourage gender equity would be carried out in the course of the year. The college would procure a sanitary napkin

vending machine and an incinerator for the girls' common room. The machines would be paid for out of the Students Amalgamated Fund. The Women Cell members would, like the previous year, offer their services for counseling to the students on all issues pertaining to gender.

In the month of March, 2018 stock was taken to assess the progress on the activities planned for the session 2017-18. The IQAC was adequately satisfied by the implementation of the prospective plans for the session 2017-18. It was decided that the gaps in planning and progress were to be addressed in the coming session.
